Each year Casper First divides 10% of all the tithes and offerings between ministries. This year they include; a pastor in the mission communities of; Kamwangu, Kenya and Channel North Africa, Medical Centers of West Africa, Interfaith of Natrona County, and the Dorcas Comfort Ministry's fleece blanket ministry.

One of those ministries is Interfaith of Natrona County, founded in 1984. The non-profit is committed to assist those in need. Through the efforts of the late Barbara Pringle, long-time FPC member, the organization's primary focus is homelessness prevention through a broad range of emergency services and a case management program that promotes self-sufficiency.

Our church's donation will be \$1,000. Throughout the year however; we encourage individuals to help Interfaith in other ways.
