(AKA Zach) greeted close to 300 short, costumed people with pieces of chocolate. Many thanks to all who donated to our purchase of chocolate!



Butterfly Tree

On November 29th at 10 AM, the Butterfly Tree will be set up and decorated in the Parlor. Each of the butterfly tags on the tree identifies the name, age, and size of a child of current or former guest of The Transformation Center (the Central WY Rescue Mission's shelter for women and children) who could use a bit of help in providing gifts for their children or grandchildren.

Parish Life invites everyone to choose one or more Butterfly Tags from the tree. Just record the child's name from the tag and your name on the clipboard by the tree, and then be blessed while shopping for your gifts!



*Boys should receive:

1. A hoody/sweater/shirt and
2. Jeans/slacks

*Girls should receive:

1. A hoody/sweater/blouse and
2. Jeans/skirt/dress



Gifts should be somewhat comparable since some children may be opening gifts together. Some of the tags will also note much needed items for TTC itself or for ALL the emergency shelter guests to use. Other tags will have items for the upstairs discipleship program guests that they can share.

By December 21st, please wrap and return your gifts to the tree in the parlor, attaching the butterfly tag to the package. Do NOT put your name on the gift or tag.

Sorting and delivery of the gifts will take place on Sunday the 21st. If you would like to help sort gifts and deliver them to TTC on the 21st, please meet in the parlor after Worship that day!

- repaired toilets

CWRM Family Rescue Initiative (FRI)



A Call to Casper Faith Communities: Meet the Challenge!

At our recent Parish Life Ministry meeting, Ellen Mennell, from the Central Wyoming Rescue Mission, shared an exciting new opportunity for Casper churches, the FAMILY RESCUE INITIATIVE. For the last year, Ellen volunteered her time to lead monthly workshops on mentoring INDIVIDUAL Mission Program guests. This fall, Ellen was hired part-time to develop a mentoring program for homeless FAMILIES. The Initiative is modeled after a successful program used at the Denver Rescue Mission. The chaplain there is a friend of Brad Hopkins, CWRM director, and is also an EPC pastor. FPC commissioners have met at Presbytery of the West meetings.

DESIRE OF FAMILY RESCUE INITIATIVE: having "a community effort to end homelessness for families in the city of Casper

[and] envisioning "faith-based communities fulfilling the great commission of servicing those in desperate need." Interfaith and Community Action are among those consulted to identify candidates in the community. NCSA believes 150 families are presently homeless in Casper; they now live in their cars, campers, hotels, or at Life Steps.

ELLEN'S TASK: creating media materials and curriculum for CHURCH MENTORING TEAMS OF 2-6 to use with families identified and screened by the Mission. She has contacted all 87 churches in Casper to ask them to pray about coming onboard the FAMILY RESCUE INITIATIVE. To date, 2 churches have committed.

NECESSARY COMMITMENTS AND EXPECTATIONS:

- > Each CHURCH commits to create a CHURCH MENTORING TEAM of 2-6 from our midst
- > Each TEAM commits to participate in a 90-minute training at the Mission with Ellen. Included is time to ask questions and clear up any concerns. Next the team meets with the family seven times over a 4-6 month period, preferably at the TEAM'S church. It is desired, but not required, for the

family to begin attending that church. With God's guidance, the team uses the curriculum to guide the family towards self-sufficiency.

> Each FAMILY commits to attend the 7 meetings. They must have at least 1 job income for a minimum of 3 months, have no felonies, and be married.

> CWRM'S FAMILY RESCUE INITIATIVE commits to provide the TEAM'S 90 minute training session, to provide an outline for each Mentoring Team/ Family meeting, to supply the mentoring tools (financial, goal-setting, and parenting guidebooks), to follow up monthly with the TEAM, and to have a quarterly Mentor's Roundtable training with all TEAMS. No TEAM is left to wonder what to do next ... help is always available. Finally, CWRM commits to provide each homeless family with \$1000 towards 1st month's rent and deposit and guide them as they search for housing in Casper's pitiful low income housing market.

CASPER FIRST'S PART IN THE FAMILY RESCUE INITIATIVE:
After Ellen's visit, Parish Life

members recommended to Session that First Pres should become one of the faith-based communities helping to end homelessness for families in our community. Session approved Parish Life's request. Parish Life also received the blessings of the Board of Deacons and the Evangelism Committee.

WHAT'S NEXT?? FPC MENTORS ARE NEEDED! Take time to pray about these questions!!!

* Do you desire to teach, inspire, and empower someone else?

* Do you long to be a living expression of God's kindness to those less fortunate?

* Do you have gifts waiting to be unearthed through acts of service?

If you answered "YES" to any of these questions, contact a Parish Life member (Edith, Nita, Meagan, Jean, Jane, Sheryl, MH). The Holy Spirit and CWRM will equip you, so experience is NOT a prerequisite. Both men and women are needed. Think of the difference less than 24 hours of your time and your love could make in a family's future!
